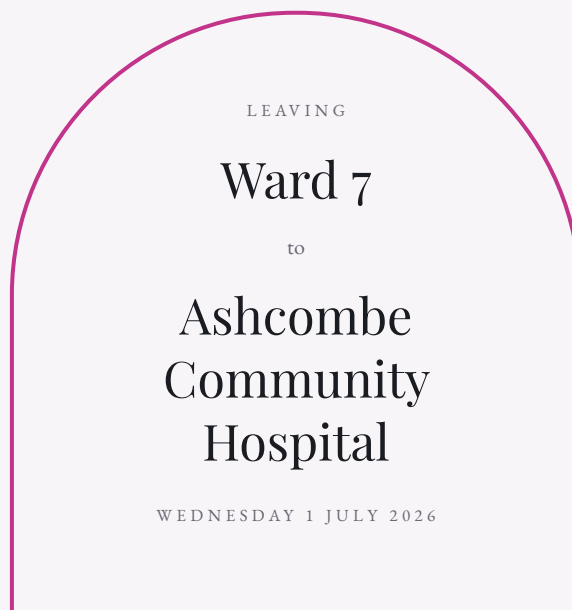


Marion Whitcombe is moving hospital, not going home

WHAT WE HAVE DONE

The wrist. Broken at the left forearm on 21 June, straightened and set in a cast the same evening. No operation needed.

The blood pressure. Amlodipine stopped on 23 June after a symptomatic drop on standing. Readings normal from the fifth day.

The infection. A five-day course finished on the ward on 26 June. No medicine to continue.

The vitamin D. Low on the admission bloods and replaced with 800 units a day. Three months, then a review.

WHAT ASHCOMBE IS ASKED TO DO

Keep the practice going. Stairs and single-leg balance daily. She is independent washing and dressing with one hand.

Watch the standing pressure. Lying and standing readings twice a week while the amlodipine stays off.

Send her to clinic. Fracture clinic on 4 July at 10:20 for a plaster check and new pictures.

Write to her practice. Harborview has this sheet. Send them your own summary when she leaves you.
