Scheduled exports, and the end of the Thursday morning download

The feature asked for more than any other since we shipped the API is here: a report can now put itself in an inbox, a bucket, or a shared drive on a schedule you set once. **Nothing about your existing reports changes** — a schedule is added to a report you already have, and can be removed the same way.

New Four additions, all available on every plan

Scheduled exports · new

Daily, weekly or monthly, to email, S3 or a shared drive. Schedules run in the workspace time zone and skip a run rather than queueing it if the previous one is still going.

Template folders · new

Two levels of folder, with the permission set on the folder rather than on each template. Existing templates are all in a root folder and nothing moved on upgrade.

Signed download links · new

Share a rendered document with somebody outside the workspace for a window you choose, from fifteen minutes to thirty days. Links can be revoked, and revocation is immediate.

Render webhooks · new

A callback on success and on failure, with the render id, the duration and the byte count. Retried five times with a widening delay, then written to the failure log.

Changed Behaviour that is different, and worth knowing about

Render queue	Priority is now per workspace rather than global, so a large batch no longer delays a single interactive render. Median wait fell from 4.1s to 0.9s.
Font upload	Accepts WOFF2 in addition to TTF and OTF, and reports the licence field if the file carries one.
API errors	Every 4xx now carries a documentation URL alongside the code. The codes themselves are unchanged.
Sample data	Arrays longer than 200 rows are truncated in the editor preview only. Renders are unaffected.
Audit log	Retained for twelve months on every plan, up from three, and exportable as CSV.

Fixed Twenty-three issues; the six that were reported most

Page numbering	A document whose first page was a cover counted it in Page 1 of n . It no longer does.
Table headers	A header row could repeat on a page that carried no body rows. It now moves with the first row.
Long filenames	Downloads truncated names over 96 characters without an extension. Fixed, and the extension is preserved.

One breaking change

- The `/v1/render` response no longer includes `previewUrl`.** It was undocumented, it pointed at a cache that is now per-region, and three workspaces were reading it. Use the signed link endpoint instead. The field is accepted and ignored in requests until 1 June 2026.
